






Field Trip- One Day Weaver


Krishnashtami Celebrations

Gosharpener-STRAW




Address Health Session

Class Activities Pre-Primary


Activity: Bilateral Brain Coordination

This activity helps to create more fun, easier to understand, helpful for learning colors. In this activity both hands work together and help to develop fine motor skills.



Activity : Puppet making

Children design their own characters and later use them in storytelling or pretend play, which builds imagination and expression.





Class Activities Pre-Primary

Activity : Making shapes with pencils

They will build shapes like square, triangle, rectangle, and more using pencils. This makes learning visual and fun!



Activity : Match and count

Children learn to count, identify and recognize numbers like 1, 2, 3... in a fun way.



Activity : Tens and Ones

Children begin to break down numbers and think in parts (e.g., "I have 2 tens and 3 ones—that's 23").

Special Celebrations:

Friendship Day : Children learn about kindness, sharing, and caring by making and giving a band to a friend.



Ganesh Chaturthi : Handling leaves, gluing, and arranging parts helps strengthen finger control and coordination. Using natural leaves instead of artificial materials teaches children to respect and care for nature.

Subject :EVS

Lesson :Staying safe

Activity :Traffic lights.

This activity helps children understand the meaning of traffic lights (Red - Stop, Yellow - Get Ready, Green - Go).

To create awareness about the importance of following traffic rules.



Subject :EVS

Lesson: Plants Around Us

Activity: Types of plants (live activity)

This activity will help the students to understand that plants are all around us. They are of different shapes and sizes. We can see them in gardens, parks, and on the roadside. Plants give us food, shade, and fresh air. We must take care of them.

Subject: Mathematics

Lesson: Shapes

Topic: 2D Shapes

Activity: Art Using Ice Cream Sticks

Students created parts of a face using different shapes with ice cream sticks. This activity helped them understand and recognize the different shapes around them.

Lesson: Measurement

Topic: Standard Units of Measurement

Activity: Drawing Standard Units on an A4 Sheet

Students drew representations of standard units such as scale (length), kilogram (weight), and litre (capacity). This activity helped them understand and identify standard units of measurement used in daily life.

Topic: Plants Around Us.

Activity: Germination of seeds(Fenugreekseeds)/
Reuse and recycle.



This activity helps students to understand that plants are living things. Just like us, they need food (nutrients from soil), water, and air to live and grow.

Lesson: Patterns and Symmetry

Topic: Patterns

Activity: Making Patterns Using Different Leaves

Students created patterns using various leaves. This activity helped them observe and understand natural patterns in their surroundings.



Subject :Social Science

Topic : My India

Activity:Physical divisions of India.

To enable students to identify and understand the different physical divisions of India - mountains, plains, desert, plateau, coastal areas, and islands - and to appreciate how these landforms influence the life, culture, and activities of people, thereby developing map skills, environmental awareness, and love for our country's natural diversity.






Class Activities Grade IV

Subject: Mathematics

Topic: Time- My Daily Routine

Activity: As part of the Subject Enrichment Activity on Time, students prepared a Daily Routine Chart with clock drawings to show different activities like waking up, going to school, playing, and sleeping. This activity helped them connect time with real-life situations, improved their time-reading skills, and made learning more creative and enjoyable.




Class Activities Grade VII
