




National Nutrition Mission







Laurus Summer Camp


With a well-rounded mix of activities, the summer camp is off to a fantastic start, and we look forward to an unforgettable summer filled with adventure and learning.

The first Parent-Teacher Meeting for Grade 10 was a great success, providing parents with an opportunity to discuss their children's progress and review strategies for upcoming studies.




Class Activities

"Thank You, Mom!" activity allowed Grade 1 students to express their love and gratitude towards their mothers while developing essential skills.



The activity also supported social interaction as students shared their ideas with classmates, building confidence in speaking and listening. Overall, it was a joyful and educational experience that blended art with language learning.






This meaningful experience allowed students to express emotions, build empathy and grow both linguistically and personally.








Class Activities
