





Grade I

Subject: English & EVS

Activity: Community Helper Dress-Up Day

Description:

Grade 2

Subject: English & EVS

Grade I & II

Subject: Mathematics

Activity: Place Value and Face Value

Students used Ones, Tens, and Hundreds blocks to build and explore numbers. They identified the place value of digits based on the block type (ones, tens, or hundreds) and learned to distinguish it from the face value of each digit.



Grade III

Subject: English

Activity: Word Scavenger Hunt

Description:

Word Scavenger Hunt is a fun and exciting game where students look for specific words or examples around them, based on a theme or list. This activity helped our students improve their vocabulary, spelling and understanding of words in an enjoyable and interactive way. By searching for words in their surroundings or texts, students strengthen their language skills while having fun.



Grade IV

Subject: Social Studies

Activity: Physical Features: Map Creation and Colouring of Physical Features

Description:


Grade V

Grade V

Subject: Social Studies

Description

Students of Grade V explored the characteristics of the Torrid Zone as a part of SEA (Subject Enrichment Activity). Each student wrote a short paragraph describing life in this zone, covering aspects such as the hot and humid climate, the tropical regions it includes and the dense vegetation like rainforests. Through this activity, students enhanced their understanding of global climatic zones and developed descriptive writing skills by connecting geography to daily life.




Grade V


Grade VI

Students enacted scenes from early human life, showcasing their lifestyle, tools, and survival methods. This helped them understand the beginning of human history in an interactive and engaging way.




Grade VI

The activity allowed students to apply their geographical knowledge creatively while understanding the relationship between landforms and human life.

Students researched and presented the First war of Independence in India through Power Point Presentations. They have researched about the different factors that led to the movement and also the role of different personalities in the fight.




Grade IX
