**Subject: Social**


**Topic: Our Heritage**

# Class Activities


**Grade 6 A & B**

The meeting strengthened the parent-teacher partnership, ensuring a supportive environment for our students to thrive. We appreciate the active participation and commitment of all attendees!






# Simple Act of Kindness
